The Rules of the list and combat conventions for the Kingdom of Lochac apply except where stated below.

- The tourney will be in single combat Round Robin Style.
- Polearms, Long Swords, Great Swords and Mass Weapons are encouraged.
- All bouts will be best of three telling blows.
- Grasping of hafts, hilts and pommels of weapons is allowed.
- Disarmed will count as one telling blow.
- Hands as targets: to be treated like groin shots, not to be specifically targeted but if hit counts as a legal target.
- Half-Swording of Longswords is allowed. The murder stroke may not be used.
- The combatants are considered to be as Armoured. Blows to visible plate armoured areas with non polearm weapons are considered light. That is cloth, leather and chain armour and grilled faceplates are taken as normal.
