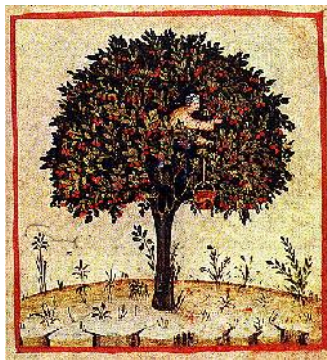

Midwinter 2012 (Barony of Innilgard)

- An item of any kind, made from wool.
- An item of armour, for man or beast.
- Food that travels well. Ideally to be presented at the event, however photos and comments from tasters will be accepted.
