We have recieved word from Our cousins in St Florian and would like to pass on this news:

Hello to the Barony of St Florian de la Riviere and Friends.

Rowany Festival is on between the 24th - 29th of March this year so it is much earlier than usual. The bookings for the St Florian's campsite at Rowany Festival are being taken now for those people who wish to camp with us.

All prices are based upon when you pay for your booking. If you book in November but pay in March, you will be charged the March price. They do not include entry cost to Rowany Festival. They also do not include use of the armouring tent.

The campsite fees are a baseline \$110 per person with discounts for booking early and penalties for booking late (known as ****head tax).

Campsite Fees:

Book & Confirm in November is \$100 (10% discount)

Book & Confirm in December is \$105 (5% discount)

Book & Confirm in January is \$110

Book & Confirm in February is \$130

Book & Confirm in March is \$150

For those people from are joining the campsite overseas please contact Gabriel privately to arrange a scheme for payment.

Costs for use of Armouring Tent if you are a member of St Florian encampment is \$20. This includes the use of the Armouring tent, half a table and the water wenching costs.

If you wish to use the St Florian shower facilities while not being part of the to St Florian encampment, the cost will be \$25.
