This Month in History

On June 15, 1215 King John signed the Magna Carta (or more correctly applied the royal seal) at Runnymede. The Magna Carter contained 63 clauses and was designed to limit the royal powers of the king and ensure that he was subject to the law and not above it.

Only 3 clauses contained in the Magna Carter are still law including on of the most famous *no free man shall be imprisoned, dispossessed, outlawed or exiled without the lawful judgement of his equals or by the law of the land*

The term Magna Carter means “The Great Charter” or “Charter of Liberties”.

Missive from their Excellencies
Baron & Baroness of Aneala

Greetings unto the populace of fair Aneala, and also to her neighbours and friends. Their Majesties, Theuderic and Engelin, and Their Royal Highnesses Gabriel and Constanzia, have made the following requests with regard to the selection of the next Baron and Baroness of Aneala.

Both sets of candidates having now made their intent known to ourselves and to their Majesties and Royal Highnesses, it is now up to you, noble and gentle friends, to advise the Crown as to which couple you believe would be most suitable to lead the Barony on behalf of Their Majesties.

The Crown and Their Royal Highnesses have requested that consultation with the Anealan populace be concluded on the 27th day of June. This consultation is to be received directly by Their Majesties and Their Royal Highnesses.

The Crown desire to have the Anealan succession decided by the end of June. The successful and unsuccessful candidates will be advised prior to the announcement to the populace, and as Their Majesties believe that this matter is of high importance to the Kingdom they therefore deem the appropriate location for this announcement is a Kingdom Court at Coronation.

This being so, there will be held a meet-and-greet session with the candidates on **Saturday, June 20**, at a time and location to be advised. During this session, you will have the opportunity to hear the candidates speak about their goals and intentions for the Barony, and also to ask them any questions you may have regarding their prospective reigns.

Their Majesties and Royal Highnesses have requested that you, the people of Aneala, send them word directly as to your opinion regarding the Baronial candidates. They would like to be contacted electronically where possible through crown@sca.org.au and heirs@sca.org.au. If a hard copy document is to be received, it would be preferred if this could be scanned and emailed for expediency and support should be sought through the Seneschal or Baron and Baroness of Aneala. However, if this is not possible, it can be posted to 422 Watson Road, Acacia Ridge Qld 4110. It is to be received by the 27th day in June.

Their Majesties and Royal Highnesses are seeking the opinion of those who directly participate with the Barony of Aneala and her cantons and colleges. Opinions will be noted by surrounding group members particularly around regional growth and development, however greater weight will be considered for those who live within the boundaries of Aneala, and who are paid members.

Consultation is to include strengths and weaknesses of all candidates and will sit in order of preference. This needs to be very clearly articulated so that the Crown and Infante understand your wishes.

If insufficient information is received, please note that the Crown may choose to appoint a vicar, or to seek alternative candidates than the present nominees.

Details should be also included from the person providing the information - such as membership, group they reside, participation levels (depth of experience with the group/sca, be they an officer, active peer etc). Please provide contact details so that contact can be made to clarify your information if necessary.

Information provided to the Heirs and Crown of Locharac will remain confidential. Please feel free to be open and honest, but do note that this is not the opportunity for personal attack or malice. Their Majesties and Royal Highnesses ask that where possible an impartial and unbiased observation be made with a view to the best benefits of the Barony and greater region for Their consideration.

Their Majesties and Royal Highnesses assure you all that the decision of appointing the next Baron and Baroness of Aneala is a weighty and important one to the Kingdom of Locharac, and all due consideration will be taken.

The decision of the Crown in this matter will be final when made so please participate in providing your advice within the stipulated timeframes.


Unto the populace I send greetings.
