





As previously published on the populace email list, and also on Facebook, here are the rules for eligibility to compete, and the duties of the champions.


All those with the appropriate authorisations are eligible to compete, excepting only

\* those who are champions in another group outside the Barony (at present only the Shire of Abertridwr). Note that the archery champion of Dragons Bay, which is a Canton within Aneala, is not excluded

\* those who are not willing or able to perform the duties of Champion, should they be victorious

The new Arts and Sciences Champion will also be announced at Championship weekend. The weekend will be your final opportunity to enter work in an open A&S competition, with your score counting towards this years competition.

We look forward to seeing you all there. Please book soon.



## Blast from the (Anealan) Past

Earlier this year I received from Viscountess Ingerith from Innilgard some Anealan reports from the early 80's. I thought the populace may enjoy reading about Aneala's 12<sup>th</sup> Night from 1983.

"Twelfth Night was our most successful non-fighting event to date. Twenty-five people attended, including six people who had not been to an SCA event before. The menu consisted of several courses - Perushka or "little pies" from 15<sup>th</sup> century Russia; Twelfth night cake (someone swallowed the bean and we had to resort to drawing straws for a bean king!); Gourd Soup as prepared for Richard II; Roast Beast, Rabbits stuffed with walnuts well basted; Sallets, and Lenten Fish; concluded with Peaches seetbed and preserved after the manner of Nostradamus."



# Kingdom of Lochac A&S Competitions

**November Crown II (2016)** hosted by the Barony of Riverhaven

*A weaving implement* - Heddles, box loom, weaving sword, warp weights, tablets for card weaving made from horn, bronze etc.

*Children's Clothing* - An item or full outfit from any era.

*An item utilising fur* - The fur can form the whole item or a part of it i.e. clothing, accessories etc. Faux fur can be used.

**Twelfth Night II (2017)** hosted by the Barony of Politarchopolis

*A nautical item* - For Captain or crew. Navigation item, rope, bucket, safety, every day tools, etc.

*An item for the hands, head or feet* - Any medium, any period. Gloves, shoes, socks, comb, brush, pattens etc.

*Something to carry liquid in* - For a journey, in the home, at work. Any medium.


