



Greetings!



With the event scheduled for the end of the month, there's only a few more weeks for re-authorisations to take place.

A copy of the authorisation paperwork may be used in lieu of an authorisation card for a period of up to three months from the date of the authorisation. I would also encourage newly authorised or reauthorised combatants to email a copy of their paperwork through to me or the appropriate marshal deputy just in case their own copy goes missing.

For those that were waiting for Authorisation cards, there were some available for collection at Festival. If you are still waiting for a card after having submitted paperwork, please let me know. 

Event Stewards*




An Introduction to Registration of Personal Names in the SCA

Most people in the SCA choose an SCA name, a historical name by which they are known in our Society. This is always optional, if you prefer to continue using your usual name, please do. Most people at some point go on to register their SCA name with the College of Arms. This is also entirely optional. Benefits of doing so include: nobody else in the SCA can also register that exact name; you have the assurance that it's reasonably historically accurate; and when the time comes that you receive an award that comes with a beautiful personalised scroll from the College of Scribes, they don't finalise your scroll until your name and device are registered. You might not care about those yet, but it can still be a very good idea to register a name before you get really attached to it, because you might well care later on.

Registering a name is usually done in consultation with a herald. They can help with the submissions process (which isn't that complicated) and making sure it meets the Standards for Evaluation of Names and Armory (which is complicated) and documenting the historical basis for the name to show that it meets the Standards (which can be extremely simple or extremely complicated).

Before looking at registration of a name, a herald can also provide resources and inspiration on historical names. A stunning amount of resources are now available, covering about a millenium and a half from Japan through Persia to Scandinavia and even to the Aztec lands - no need to restrict yourself to medieval Western Europe for inspiration. (We do have more written documentation and expertise in Western Europe, but don't let that stop you.) A herald can also help to advise what constitutes a sufficient and accurate historical source of documentation. Good places to start looking include dmnes.org and <https://s-gabriel.org/names/index.shtml>

I mentioned above the Standards for Evaluation of Names and Armory - the SCA's requirements for a name or device to be registerable, found at <http://heraldry.sca.org/sena.html#PN> . Here is a brief summary of the requirements for the name of a person:



1. Each section of your name - your whole byname or whole given name - must be from one pre-16th century time and place. This makes sense where the byname or given name has multiple words. For instance, "atte Wode" is a fine medieval English byname, but "de skógr" meaning the same thing but combining French with Old Icelandic is not going to work.
2. You need at least a given name and a byname, and they need to be in correct grammar. Names that mix name phrases from different times and/or places are allowed (for example, you can have an English byname with a French given name, because someone living in France may well have had English parentage) provided that the times or places are close enough; that is, subject to the guidelines in the Standards.
3. It has to be noticeably different from other registered SCA names and names of significant historical people, and not make it sound like you're of a particular famous family or title. You can't register Duke as a first name or "Tudor of England" as a byname phrase.
4. Names that are vulgar, derogatory or offensive by religious or political affiliation are not registerable. Not always as obvious as it seems as offensiveness can vary according to location.

There are a few ways to meet #1 and some exceptions. Names documented in period are great and plentiful. Names can also be constructed using patterns found in historical names, or from SCA branch names or place names created in a historical pattern. Names can be used in a form translated into English. And it's always valid to use part of your legal name.

You're always welcome to ask me for more information. Historical naming and name documentation is something I find really interesting. I'd be very happy to help with looking for information on any name ideas you may have and suggesting ways to put together a historical name that feels great for you.


