




In Baronial business at Pencampwr-Winterfest, we had the great pleasure of awarding the following:



A message from the Baron & Baroness on Children...

Greetings to the Populace, especially the Parents of the Populace,

We took great delight in seeing so many children at Pencampwr-Winterfest over the June long weekend! We also had the pleasure of seeing Rochelle and Daniella of Dragon's Bay admitted to the Mouse Guard by King Felix and Queen Eva, and of admitting Frosty the Half-Pint as a Companion of the Order of the Cygnets of Aneala for his Martial skill.


These happy events provide a great opportunity for us to remind everyone how children are celebrated and awarded in Aneala.

Let us start with a mention of the Mouse Guard – although it is not an Anealan award. The Mouse Guard is a Kingdom award, which can only be presented by the King & Queen of Lochac. The Mouse Guard is awarded to children from 4-13 years of age. Those who receive this award are provided with a Mouse Guard pouch.

Within the Barony of Aneala, we have an award system especially for children! It is called the Order of the Cygnets of Aneala and has two different levels – Companion of the Order and Commander of the Order. It recognises the endeavours of the youth of Aneala in three different categories:

Martial – For those who show promise in any of the martial disciplines. This includes children who participate in archery, boffer combat and (for those old enough) youth rapier combat. To be eligible for the award, children must show knowledge of the List and the Chivalric code – that is, they must be able to demonstrate an understanding of how to participate safely and fairly.

Arts & Sciences – For those who show promise in the arts & sciences. This could include anything from attending classes, making things, or even doing research. To be eligible for the award, they must demonstrate knowledge, skill or talent, and a willingness to teach others.




A message from the Baron & Baroness on Children...

Service – For those who serve the Barony. This could include helping out with various tasks, cleaning, serving as Lords/Ladies in Waiting, list-keeping, or anything else that assists with running events. To be eligible for the award, they must provide some kind of service that enhances the game for others.

When a child is first awarded for any one of these categories, they become a Companion of the Order and receive a silver feather token. When a child is awarded for a second of these categories, they remain a Companion of the Order and receive another silver feather token (this is attached to their previous token to form 1 token). When the child is then awarded for the third category, they become a Commander of the Order and receive a gold feather token (which is also attached to the other tokens to make one fancy jingly award token) and at the Commander level they receive a scroll to mark the achievement.

Having a full contingent of Companions and Commanders of the Order of the Cygnets of Aneala would greatly enrich the Barony and would bring us great pleasure. We are on the lookout for children who meet the award criteria. If you have observed any children who meet any of the above criteria, please write to us with an award recommendation in the same way that you would recommend any adult for any other award.


Finally, we are starting a Children's Championship, which will run over Baronial Championship weekend along with the other championships. The details have not yet been finalised, but we are looking at the components of the Championship possibly including boffer combat, archery, lawn games such as kubb and maybe an A&S component. 


