Archery Report to council – 21 May 2010

Saturday 24th April – an IKAC was hosted by Dragon's Bay as part of their archery championship weekend at Boddington. Marshal was Genevieve du Montfleur. 9 archers competed in open handbow division. The top scorers were Raymond of Teedermully with 134 points, Raynald Greygoose 122 and Sir Peter d'Gaunt Noir 79.

On Sunday 2nd May, in honour of the Royal visit, a Royal Round was held at Aachenfeld training. Marshal was Isabel de Annesley. 9 archers competed. The list was kept by Eloise of Aachenfeld. The top scorers were Richard of Aachenfeld on 49, Edmund Kerr on 43 and Catherine de Arc on 41. This was followed by a King's round which was won by Celestria of Ashwood at a distance of approximately 55 yards.

Sunday 16th May – an IKAC shoot was held at Aachenfeld training. Marshal was Isabel assisted by Baroness Branwen. 8 archers competed in open handbow division. The top-scorers were Edmund Kerr on 112, Isabel on 94 and Celestria on 73. One archer submitted a score in the period handbow division although we still have not received clarification from the keeper of the IKAC as to whether the equipment used is allowable in the period division of the IKAC. Archers were encouraged to enlist by email prior to the day of the shoot to avoid undue delay in getting the shoot started and this seemed to work quite well.

35 archers from the region have submitted IKAC scores so far this year. Of those 5 have an average - ie they have at least 3 scores - the best of these are Richard (whose average is 109), Edmund (99) and Isabel (70).

New and established archers are training regularly in Aachenfeld on available Sundays.

Abertridwr reports that they have done little in the way of training in the last month. They have a new target frame which is in the process of being covered and stuffed in preparation for the IKAC shoot which will take place on Sunday 6th June at Pencampwr.

3.11. Seneschal

- Membership status of officers – All officers are reminded that in order to hold a Baronial Office they must be current financial members of the SCA. The Seneschal will conduct a review of membership status in the next two weeks, please check your membership status.
- Dragon's Bay – Contact with the Kingdom Seneschalate indicates that Dragon's Bay has not yet met all requirements of the agreement with Aneala. The agreement states:
 1. The incipient Shire of Dragons Bay be recognised and incorporate the postcodes of 6124-6126, 6167-6176, 6207-8 and 6210 with further consideration of the inclusion of 6167 to be given at the time of

submitting any application for full shire status.

2. That the incipient Shire be sponsored by the Barony of Aneala until such time as it is ready to be granted full status.
3. All officers of Dragons Bay shall be approved by the Barony and by the relevant Kingdom Officer.

For its part, the incipient Shire of Dragons Bay shall undertake to do the following:

4. Officers in Dragons Bay shall effectively be 'deputies' of the relevant Baronial officer and shall report to them on such regular basis as is required by the Barony.
5. The Dragons Bay Seneschal shall also provide a copy of his report to the Kingdom Seneschal, and to the Regional Deputy Seneschal Kane Greymane (RDS) who shall act in a support and liaison role. This Seneschal's Report shall include details of all activities undertaken including the number of members and non-members participating, and a financial report.
6. All events held in Dragons Bay shall be stewarded by a member of its populace, with an event form to be signed by the Baronial Seneschal upon presentation of such information as the Seneschal shall require. The Barony shall be the 'sponsor' of such events. No event may be promoted until such time as this sponsor form is completed.
7. It should be noted that only a group with a Marshal can sponsor a fighting event.
8. Obtain approval from the College of Heraldry for the registration of the Shire's name.
9. Interact in a positive way with the groups that surround it.
10. Provide a detailed list of all officers in the Shire to the Kingdom Seneschal and the respective Kingdom Officers.
11. At the expiry of 12 months from the date of recognition of incipient status, the Shire Seneschal shall provide a detailed report on the Shire's progress towards full status.

For its part, the Barony of Aneala shall undertake to do the following:

12. Provide ongoing support for the activities of Dragons Bay and assist within reason with their development towards full Shire status.
13. Undertake the role of sponsor of any events held in Dragons Bay and consent shall not be delayed or withheld for any event without good reason. If there is a problem with a planned event, this should be reported to the RDS and the Kingdom Seneschal as soon as possible.
14. Include information on the activities undertaken in Dragons Bay in the reports of all Baronial Officers to their relevant Kingdom Officer.
15. At the end of 12 months from the date of recognition of the incipient Shire, the Baronial Seneschal shall provide a detailed report as to Dragons Bay's progress towards full status.

Incipient status is not official until such time as it is announced in Royal Court. This cannot be done until such time as the above has been agreed to and confirmation of the sponsorship arrangement has been made in writing.

It is anticipated that this sponsorship agreement should be reviewed in two years time, if Dragons Bay is not in a position to apply for full status within that time.

To achieve full status it will be necessary for the incipient Shire to:

16. Evidence of registration of the name with the College of Heralds and Laurel Sovereign at Arms, together with a petition evidencing that the populace supports this heraldry.

17. A full list of all officers taking the group forward, with approval of their appointment by the relevant Kingdom Officer.

18. A petition from members of the populace, both financial and non-financial as to their support for the group achieving recognition as a full Shire and the postcodes to be included.

It will also be necessary for the Baron and Baroness to provide a letter/email of support for full status being granted, as well as the Baronial Seneschal to provide a letter/email of support for full status.

Once all of the above information has been provided, it will then be forwarded to Their Majesties for approval and announcement. In the case of Shires, once this has been obtained the notification is then provided to the Society Seneschal and the Board of Directors.

Full status as a shire is not official until such time as it is announced in Royal Court. It will then be published as soon as possible in Pegasus.

Reporting – A suggestion has been made that Shires be considered as Canton's of the sponsoring group until they receive cipiency. It was agreed that Aneala would request that Dragons Bay report according to the Canton reporting schedule.

- SCAA Insurance – Bartholomew has confirmed that insurance at SCA events relies on two things:
 - Sign off by the Seneschal. This is critical and if approval is rescinded or not granted in the first place, the event is not covered.
 - Fits with the regular activities of the SCA. If there is a problem here the Seneschal should not be signing off on the event without Kingdom approval.
- Volunteer Recognition Award – To Celestria for producing an excellent report and in particular organising a successful transfer of bank details and signatories.
- Leave of Absence – requested by the Seneschal for 15 July to 30 July to attend wedding duties. Approved unanimously.
- Appointment of Acting Seneschal – Catherine agreed to act in this role.

- Officer attendance at meetings – Officers must attend meetings unless they apologise prior to the meeting. Three missed meetings without explanation is grounds for removal from office.
- Upcoming Officer Changeovers – Chatelaine , Chronicler, Herald – September, Constable – August.
- Non-reporting officers – must be reported to Kingdom.
- **ACTIONS FROM PREVIOUS MEETING** – Bartholomew emailed re: adding boffer results to Anealan website. A&S Minister has reported following last meeting. Dragon’s Bay Event submissions followed up with Sir Peter and Petronilla and they have acknowledged Aneala’s request to submit event forms and have these approved before advertising. Followed up with St Lazarus re: reporting and contact with Kingdom Seneschal, awaiting formal paperwork submission to Kingdom.

Old Baronial Knives – A number of knives have been identified by Catherine as inadequate and will be destroyed.

Purchases – Strainer and two pairs of long tongs. Council authorised up to \$100 to be spent on these items.
