Otherwise, it has been business as usual - I have also attached Roobis reports for the College and Canton. We have continued to discuss options to try and encourage more collegians to participate in A&S but as she is currently in Singapore that may need to wait until she returns.

## **Listkeeper**

With regard to the report I submitted for last month, there may have been a slight oversight. There was a tournament hosted by the College of St Basil the Great, however, I did not receive a list report for that event.

In the current month, there has been one event requiring a list-keeper, the Newcomers' Tournament on 17<sup>th</sup> March at Lake Monger Reserve. For this event fighters were awarded up to three lives based on the number of heraldic items displayed.

7 fighters enlisted in the armoured combat tournament, however THL Lokki Rekk was forced to withdraw due to dog-related issues. The six remaining fighters fought in a "triple elimination" format which was actually a double elimination with the winners then fighting a round robin. The victor was Sir Nathan Blacktower.

In the rapier tournament there were 4 fighters with the maximum number of lives awarded being 2. The format therefore was a double elimination. Master Dameon withdrew after injuring his ankle in the first round. The victor was Lord Zaven Zeitountsi.

**Event description:** Golden Thimble is a two-day garb challenge where teams of up to five people make a full set of garb (including underwear) for one of the team-members, with a minimum of five items being made. The challenge runs from 10 am Saturday to 3 pm Sunday, with a break from work Midnight Saturday to 7 am Sunday. Judging and fashion show from 3 pm Sunday, with the populace encouraged to attend.

Lunch and dinner on Saturday, and breakfast and lunch on Sunday are included, as well as tea and coffee. Team members may stay at the venue on Saturday night if they wish.

Three teams entered the event, but one was forced to pull out on the Wednesday before the event, due to a family tragedy. Mistress Branwen and Master Kilic stepped forward and put together a team at very short notice, so the event was still able to be contested by three teams.

The venue was very suitable for a small event of this type, with plenty of work space for about

15 people, and room for most to sleep in the studio. Many thanks to Lady Otilia for letting us use her studio space, as well as her kitchen and bathroom.

The teams produced three very different sets of clothing: 10<sup>th</sup> Century Oseburg "Viking" (Lokki's Legends); 14<sup>th</sup> Century Timurid (A Stitch in Timurid); and late 15<sup>th</sup> Century English (the Baroness's Servants).

All three teams produced excellent clothes, and the final scores reflected this. There were only 5 points between the first and third placed teams.

First place with 163 points: The Baroness's Servants - Elizabeth Rowe (model), Agostino Tamburri, Anne of Gyllingeham, Cailleach Dhe inghean Ui Dhudhghaill, Katie of Aneala  
Second place, with 162 points: Lokki's Legends - Ula of Aneala (model), Frances Affrica Ray, Susanah Scarlett, Aoife inghean Ui Conchobhair

Third place, with 158 points: A Stitch in Timurid - Branwen of Werchesforde, Otilia Adelise von Grafenbach, Kilic ibn Sungur ibn Kazganci (model)

In addition nine of the garments were made by only one team member, so were judged as individual entries for the Anealan A&S competition, if the participants wish to submit them for that purpose.

Judges were Leonie de Grey, Illaria de Vale and Elizabeth Severn.

Since Lady Ottilia provided the venue free of charge we were able to keep the cost down to \$25 for members, with free entry to those only attending on Sunday afternoon to see the final presentations.
