*Suggestions* – hand made oak Savonarola chairs, flat pack plywood chairs with magnificent embroidered cushions, tastefully re-upholstered or painted wood and canvas director's chairs, floor cushions made of stunning fabric remnants, floor cloths or rugs.

## A & S

*Judging* – Items will be judged on workmanship, authenticity, creativity (in choice of item, materials and techniques used), practicality (portability and storage, weather resistance, comfort), how much they improve the atmosphere of events, and appeal to the general populace. All projects must come with written instructions for replicating the piece (which will go on the Anzalan website for the inspiration of others) and verbal or written documentation addressing the judging criteria (tell us why your piece deserves top marks in each area, because the judges might not figure it out).

This competition will be judged at the Baroness's Fighter Auction, which gives you eight weeks and will mean more good seats for the All Fools demo.

*Prize* – the best seat in Anzala, glory, and a tassel.

### November Crown £21 (2006)

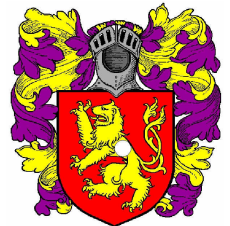
Calligraphy/Illumination: create a new AOA scroll blank

This is also a time to share new music with everyone. So if you have anything new that you would like to share it is very welcome!

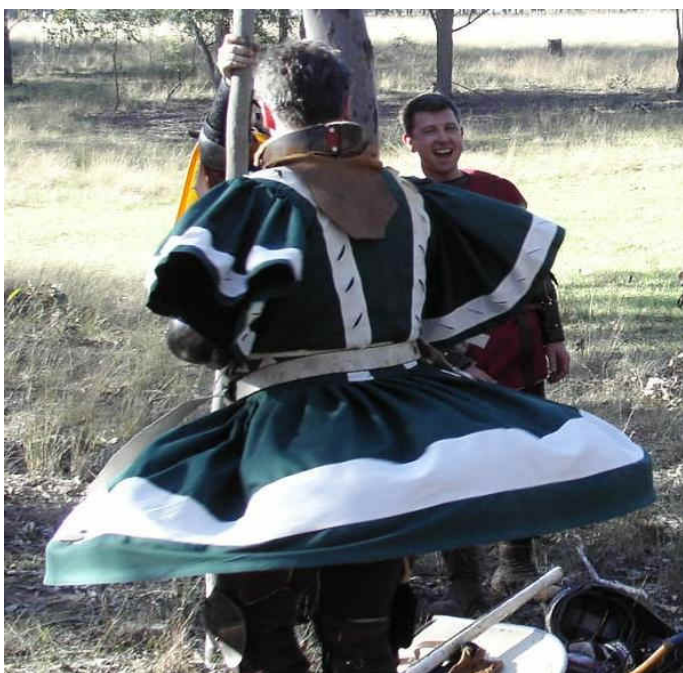
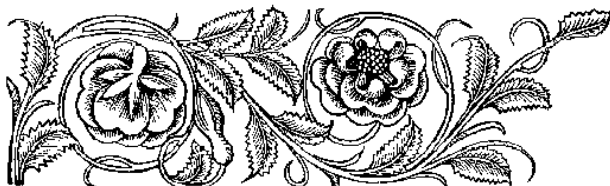
