From the Seneschal

Greetings and salutations gentle cousins From Kane Greymane,

It's Spring, a time to tourney, and Championship beckons.

The Kingdom Seneschal has asked all Seneschals to report on the number of financial members each group has. This in turn got me thinking about being a member and why we should all be involved in the SCA. On the surface membership costs about \$50 a year, which, if you're in any way active, you get back through event discounts. Group status is judged on the number of sustaining members a group has, thus being a member supports the status of the local group. Membership entitles you to have a voice in the decision making process, allows you to be an officer and helps with the costs of running the national organisation.

Talking about group status and memberships brings us to another issue. Discussion has been going on with the members of the Canton of Abertridwr who live in Rockingham and Mandurah about them wishing to form a group in those areas. At present the group is proposed to be a Shire.

I think this is a great idea, as we could really use regular events happening in that region. The establishment process involves the Seneschals talking about the boundaries, and the members of the postcode areas concerned voting on whether they wish to be in the new group or not. If you have any concerns about this process you can find reference to it in the governing documents of the SCA, the Corpora. I am also very happy to discuss any concerns you may have.
