Inter-Kingdom Archery Competition AS XLV [2010]

This year's regional IKAC saw 42 archers participating in Open Bow Division, 1 in Period Bow Division and 3 in Youth Bow Division.

This year's winner was chosen on the basis of each archer's average of their top 3 scores. Baroness Mistress Catherine de Arc won overall champion this year, receiving a pewter token with tassel, both made by Lady Alianore.

In a second category, the archer with the most improved score (as a percentage) was Adaire of Donegal from Dragon's Bay. He will receive a gift voucher from Lady Isabel for Target Solutions.






Armoured Combat on the day will consist of two challenges: "capture the flag" and a tag team melee. Rapier Combat will be a tavern brawl and a melee.
