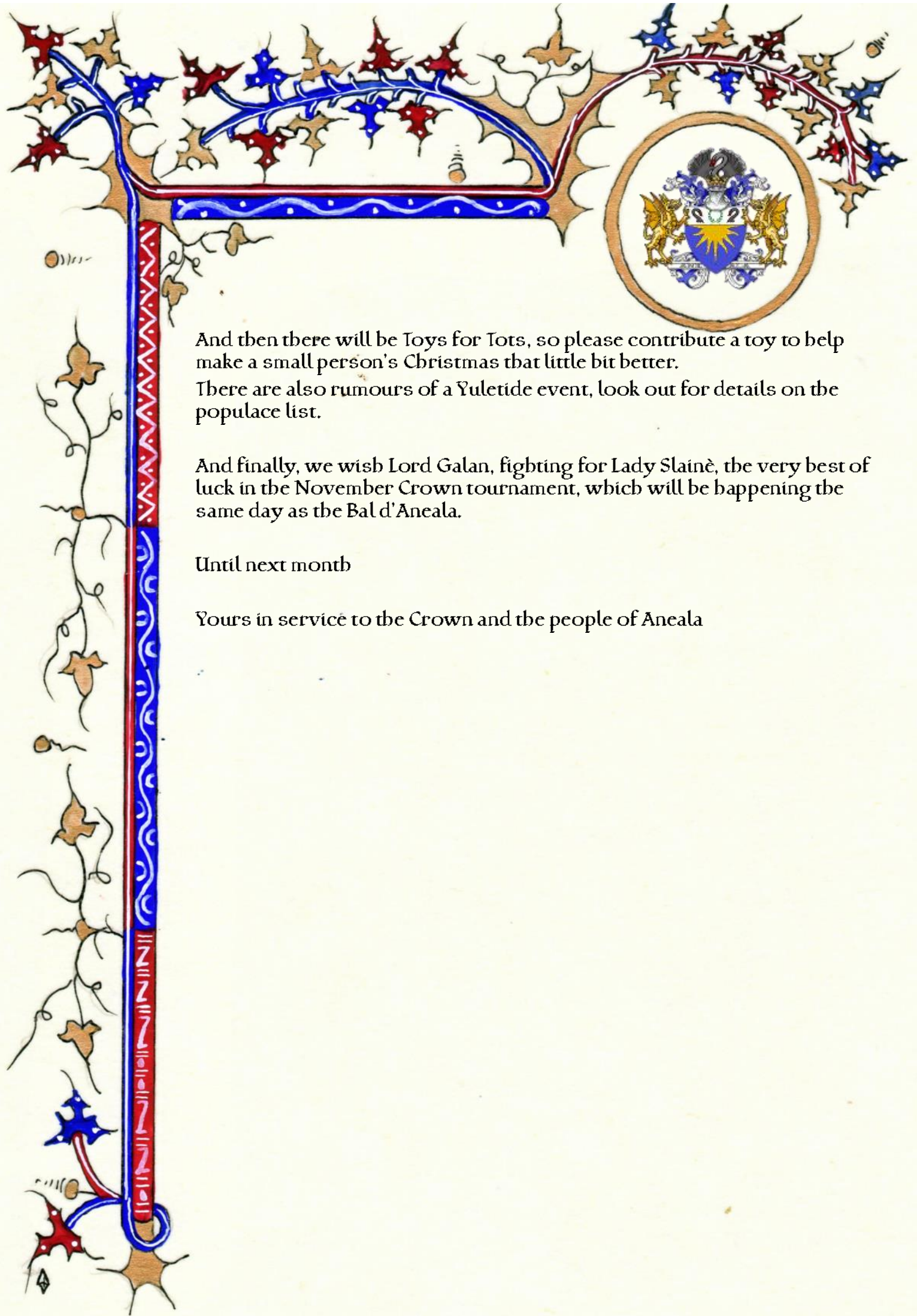

The Barony of Aneala is therefore looking for a new A & S Officer.


You do not need to have formal qualifications to be able to fulfil your requirements as A & S officer, you just need to have a love of all things A & S and a bit of free time.

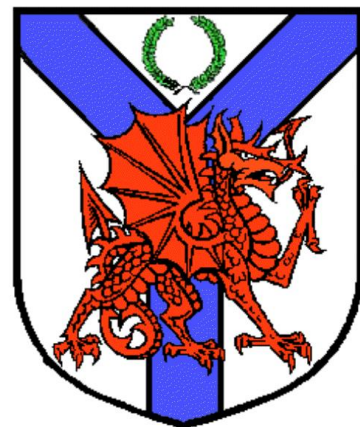

- Spotted Gum with glued on riser 71" NTN 27lb @ 28"
- Ash with glued on riser & small arrow shelf 67 ½ " NTN 33lbs @ 28"
- Solid Ash (dyed) 68 ½" NTN 34lbs @ 28"
- Spotted Gum with glued on riser 67" NTN 33lbs @ 28"
- Ash with glued on riser 66 ½" NTN 39lbs @ 28"
- Laminated limbs of Lemonwood & Rock Maple with Jarrah riser 68 ½ " NTN 25lbs @ 28"
