Best memory from an event?


Being made a Court Baroness in Atenveldt.

Autumn Gathering once again returns!


Autumn Gathering is an event that brings together the diverse SCA groups in Western Australia for a long weekend of camping, community and fun.

Jewellery - Time period 1300 to 1600 - for a man or woman. No pearls are to be used.

An embroidered illuminated letter - The design may be your own or copied. Documentation must identify your inspiration. i.e. a drawing of your original design or a photocopy (with references) of the copied letter.

A wooden item - Which may have been used in a medieval torture chamber.

Midwinter II (2016) hosted by TBA...

Leather work - An item made from leather with might be useful for a calligrapher and/or an illuminator.

From the bedroom - Any item which might have been used or worn in the medieval bedroom.

From or for a Brewer - Aside from the brew itself think of seals, serving, ingredients, measures, labels, containers, stoppers, etc.




