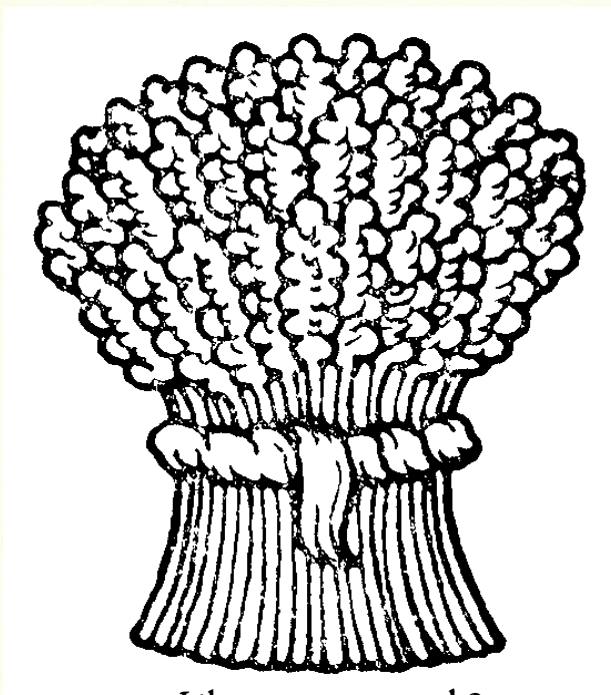

On Sunday the weather was kinder, so we were able to enjoy more archery, and His Majesty again donned armour, to share some tips in fighting Florentine style. Another delicious lunch was served, before the King and Queen took their leave.

Leather work - An item made from leather with might be useful for a calligrapher and/or an illuminator.

From the bedroom - Any item which might have been used or worn in the medieval bedroom.

From or for a Brewer - Aside from the brew itself think of seals, serving, ingredients, measures, labels, containers, stoppers, etc.

November Crown II (2016) hosted by the Barony of Riverhaven

A weaving implement - Heddles, box loom, weaving sword, warp weights, tablets for card weaving made from horn, bronze etc.

Children's Clothing - An item or full outfit from any era.

An item utilising fur - The fur can form the whole item or a part of it i.e. clothing, accessories etc. Faux fur can be used.

Twelfth Night II (2017) hosted by the Barony of Politarchopolis

A nautical item - For Captain or crew. Navigation item, rope, bucket, safety, every day tools, etc.

An item for the hands, head or feet - Any medium, any period. Gloves, shoes, socks, comb, brush, pattens etc.

Something to carry liquid in - For a journey, in the home, at work. Any medium.
