

Spotlight On - Courts

One aspect of the SCA which sets us apart from many other historical groups is the holding of a Royal or Baronial Court. You can expect a Court to be held at almost every SCA event, but for those who are new to the group it can be a strange and unusual experience. Here's a quick guide to Court:

What is Court?

Court is a gathering where the Crown or their local representatives will bring everyone together to make announcements and present awards in an immersive and theatrical manner. In the Barony of Aneala you are likely to see Baronial Court often, held by the Baron & Baroness, and Royal Court less often, because that is held by the King & Queen.

Can I Attend Court and Why Would I Want To?

Everyone can attend Baronial Court and is encouraged to! Baronial Court is often used to share important announcements with the attendees of an event, such as site or scheduling information. It's also nice to attend to witness and support those who receive Baronial awards, where they are recognised for their great efforts in a particular field.

What If I Get Called Up?

Uh-oh! The Baronial Herald has just called your name and asked you to "Approach Their Excellencies" (or in a Royal Court, "Their Majesties"). What do you do?

1. Rise, if seated, and enter the aisle so that you are directly in front of the Baron & Baroness. Walk towards them.
2. When you enter the "Royal Presence" – approximately 3 metres away from the Baron & Baroness – make a reverence. That is, bow or curtsy.
3. Continue toward the Baron & Baroness and choose who you will approach (they may indicate for you to approach one or the other specifically).
4. Kneel on a cushion. The kneeling cushions are there to be used. Please don't hurt your knees on the floor! If kneeling is a problem for you, other options include use of the mercy stool, sitting on a chair, or standing. Simply say, "Your Excellencies, may I [insert an option that works for you] instead of kneel?" A chair or stool will be brought for you by someone in the Court, if needed.
5. When Their Excellencies have finished their business with you, wait for them to say "you have our leave to depart" before you rise.
6. Make a reverence (bow/curtsy) when you rise, then walk backwards away from the Baron & Baroness. When you get to approximately 3 metres away – the same spot where you made a reverence before – make reverence again. From this point, it is acceptable to turn your back and walk away back to your spot.



Getting called up in Court for the first time can be exciting and maybe a little nerve-wracking, but rest assured that the Crown and their representatives always aim to make Court an enjoyable experience for those who are called to participate and those who watch it happen.


