The Golden Thimble is a garb Competition held bi-annually. This Competition where a team or individuals construct garb for a person. The team has up to a max of 5 people including the Garb subject, and needs enter up to 4 main pieces of garb (i.e., underclothes/shirt, under tunic, kirtle /overdress, coat/jacket, cloak, shoes, hat, armour equivalents and 1 Accessory, (i.e. hat, belt, pouch, hose, feast item).

There will also be an Individual Competition. Where they are required to construct minimum one main item and one accessory.

More details will be posted to the normal Aneala Group Pages and List.

So now is the time to decide who needs garb, who will benefit the most, what period, who to invite to be in a team or if you want to do something for yourself. Keep in mind the Raids Event is just 4 week later.
