There are big things coming in the next few months! Here are the key events currently on the calendar:

With Championship only a few weeks away, we would like to share more information about this important event:

The Champions of Aneala hold an important and honoured role. They are the Champions of the Barony and thus have the great honour of representing the Barony to and among other groups. Planning to travel? Travelling as a Champion is particularly special!

They are also the Champions of the Baron & Baroness: the Champions of the Sword, Rapier & Bow are expected to stand in Court with us, bearing their regalia and symbols of their office, ready to defend the populace and/or the Baron & Baroness (or visiting Barons & Baronesses, or the Crown) as necessary. It is an honour and a privilege to serve in Court (plus you get the best view!)

Finally, they are the Champions of the discipline in which they demonstrated prowess and won the Championship – rattan combat, rapier, archery, arts & sciences. As Champion, you have the responsibility of promoting and encouraging your artform for the year in which you serve. This might mean running an event, teaching classes, or just making sure that you show up to trainings and workshops in order to encourage everyone.

This year, when we call for letters of intent, we would love to hear what you want to do to encourage and support your particular discipline. Do you have plans for a fun event? Do you have a class you'd like to run? Do you have some other amazing plan to get people into what you're into? We would like to know in advance of Championship.

Please note that being Champion also carries the following responsibilities: Keep & maintain the regalia Guard the Baron & Baroness in Court (martial Champions) Run the tournament for the next year's Championship.

We also run a Children's Championship, which varies in format depending on number of children attending and available activities – so details TBC. The winner of the Children's Championship will be offered the opportunity to become our Page and provide help and support to us throughout the next year. We have been particularly impressed by our current Page, Kierun of Aneala, so there is a high bar for the quality of service that a Page can provide!

Lochac Cooks Guild



Pine Nut Garlic Sauce

Sauce Which is Called Pine Nut Dish of Garlic

You will take a pound of pine nuts, and another of peeled almonds, and grind them very well, each by itself, and then both together. And cook two heads of garlic in a little pot with broth of hen or mutton; and then when the garlic is well-cooked, grind it with the pine nuts and with the well-peeled almonds; first [grind] the garlic, and when it is all well-ground, grind also with it a little grated cheese, which is very good, with eight or nine hard-boiled egg yolks; and when everything is well-ground, blend it with the broth of hen, and mutton. And set it to cook in a very clean pot; and cast into it one or two ounces of sugar, and a little bit of rose vinegar tempered with rose-water in which crushed cloves, and ginger, and cinnamon, and pepper have been steeping overnight; and cook it until it is cooked and quite thick; and prepare dishes, and cast sugar and cinnamon over it.

½ pound Pine Nuts
1 Tbsp. White Wine Vinegar
½ pound Blanched Almonds, grounded
1 tsp. Orange Blossom Water
2 Heads of Garlic
½ tsp. powdered ginger
2½ cups Chicken Broth
¼ tsp. ground cinnamon
5 cooked egg yolks
¼ tsp. ground cloves
1 oz. sugar

Separate cloves of garlic and peel. Bring chicken broth to a boil. Add garlic cloves to chicken broth and let simmer for 10 minutes. Remove garlic cloves from chicken broth and reserve remaining broth. Grind almonds & pine nuts in food processor. When garlic is tender, place in food processor and pulse until a paste is formed. Mix garlic paste, egg yolks, nuts, vinegar, orange blossom water and spices until incorporated. Add to reserved chicken broth and whisk. Place pot with mixture on fire and heat until desired consistency. Sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar on serving dish.


