

Fencing Marshal's Missive



ENGAGEMENT IN MELEE

There are several important engagement rules to remember when participating in a Fencing war or Melee.

When participating in a melee you are deemed to be engaged with anyone within a 180° arch of the direction in which your head is pointing. This is the direction of your attention.

When participating in a teams melee or War and standing in a line, facing your opposing team, the line itself forms the 180° of attention . This means that at the start of the melee, everyone is deemed to be engaged with everyone on the opposite team. As a right hander, if I stand in a line and am turned to face someone on my left, a strike coming from my right that strikes me in the back would be legal.

Whereas a fencer or group of fencers who break from the line in an attempt to flank the opposing team and attack from behind, must deliver a proper death from behind if this convention is in use, or get a fencers FULL attention/acknowledgement before engagement.

Any fighter who has begun engagement with another fighter has acknowledged their presence, and simply turning their back to them will NOT exempt them from being struck in the back.

PLEASE NOTE- Whenever possible a proper death from behind is still encouraged and preferable If the Death from Behind convention is in place.

Any fencer who turns their back on an opponent during engagement, simply to avoid any attack would be abusing the 180° rule and this behaviour will not be tolerated.

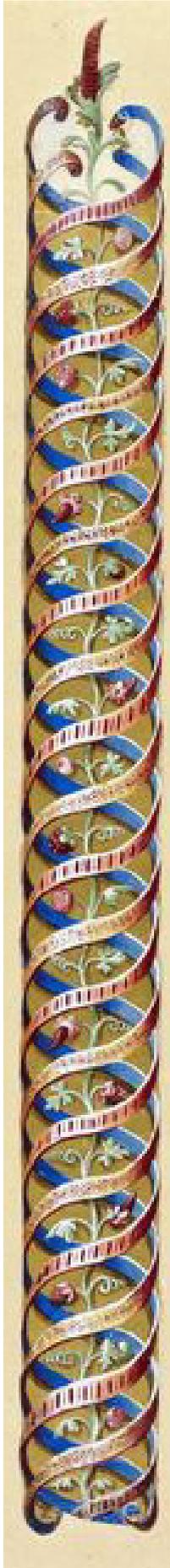
