Lochac Cooks Guild



Garlic Sauce

Here is the recipe for the garlic sauce served at Western Raids with roast beef.

This recipe is found in The Medieval Kitchen Recipes from France and Italy, Odile Redon, Francoise Sabban & Silvano Serventi (Translated by Edward Schneider) University of Chicago Press 1998

Garlic sauce for all meats: take the garlic and cook it in the embers, then pound it thoroughly and add raw garlic and crumbs for bread, and sweet spices, and broth; and mix everything together and boil it a little, and serve hot.

The redacted recipe in the book calls for 20 cloves of garlic (18 cooked and 2 raw), 1/2 cup of dry breadcrumbs (40 gms), 1 cup of broth (250 ml) and a spice mixture of 1/4 tsp ground ginger, 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon, a pinch of ground cloves, and salt.

I wanted to make a sauce which would be gluten and ginger free, as well as vegetarian, so everyone except those who can't eat garlic could try it. I was also cooking for 130 people, which is lot a garlic to peel.

Here is my version of the recipe

100 gm of unpeeled garlic cloves

40 g of fresh gluten free breadcrumbs (Sourdough is also good if you don't need to be GF)

250 ml stock (I used a Massel Beef style vegan stockcube in 250 ml of hot water) 1/2 tsp allspice

salt

If the garlic is in bulbs, break up into individual cloves, then wrap in aluminium foil and bake in the oven at 180 C for 30 minutes. Let the garlic cool, then peel the cloves. They will be very soft.

Soak the breadcrumbs in about 100 ml of the stock.

Put the garlic, soaked breadcrumbs and spice into a blender or mortar, and puree to a smooth creamy paste, adding more stock if necessary. Put in a small saucepan and bring to the boil, add salt to taste, and more stock depending on how thick you like the sauce.

Serve hot

Enjoy with any roast meat, or with roasted vegetables

Fencing Marshal

Western Raids was held in Aneala during the first weekend of June AS LIX - 2024.

Fencing was a big part of the weekend as usual. We trialled a different format to our regular type of Rapier tournaments. Friday evening saw Rapier challenges by firelight in the Holmgang style. (Holmgang is a duel practiced by early medieval Scandinavians. It was a legally recognized way to settle disputes. The name holmgang may derive from the combatants' duelling on a small island, or holm, as they do in the saga of Egill Skallagrímsson, alternatively figuratively in reference to an arena. Wikipedia)

On Saturday we held the inaugural Western Raids Cut and Thrust Tournament which attracted a respectable eight C&T authorised fencers from around the Kingdom as well as from other groups. The format for the tournament was round robin, best of three passes with simul kills counting as a loss for both fencers. This meant fencers had to be fighting defensively to stay alive while seeking the win. The winner, who was able to stay alive the most, was Chrettiene de lu Pont. My hope is for C&T to become a regular tournament feature and ideally next year will be even bigger and better.

To give opportunity for as much fencing as possible, there was also held a Challenge style tournament allowing fencers to make challenges during the entire weekend in any of the approved fencing forms, being Rapier, Cut and Thrust or RBG Duels.

Challenges could be made to any fencer for multiple passes, simul kills were counted as a loss to both fighters, with the winner of the challenge being the fencer with the most wins.

To ensure all fencers had fun, no challenges could be made to the same opponent unless ALL entrants had been challenged.

The ultimate winner of the challenge tournament was Aesa Draumspakr, visiting from InnIghard, with 96 challenge passes and overall winner of the most Rounds. Marx Lamprecht fought an impressive 102 challenge passes over the weekend and Thorfin of Uhfahol closely followed with 83 challenge passes.

This format proved so popular with the entrants that I hope it becomes a permanent tournament fixture at Western Raids.

After dodging the threatening rain on the final day, the fencing activities were wrapped up with a morning of war/melee scenarios. It was exciting to see both RBG's and spears on the war field and has inspired some fencers to make their own RBG's so next year we should see more firearms on the field of combat.

Congratulations to all Fencers who participated, had fun and didn't hurt their friends. Huzzah!!!


